KEY FEATURES OF THE SUB-FUND

WHAT ARE YOU INVESTING IN?

- You are investing in an ILP sub-fund that feeds 100% into the Underlying Fund, a portfolio of a mutual fund domiciled in Luxembourg and regulated by the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier and qualifies as a UCITS under European Union directives.
- The investment objective of the Underlying Fund is to increase the value of your investment over time through capital growth.
- The Underlying Fund is an "ESG Fund" as described in the ESG Circular.

Investment Strategy

(a) to invest only in deposits or other Excluded Investment Products; and

(b) not to engage in securities lending or repurchase transactions for the ILP sub-fund.

In actively managing the Underlying Fund, the Investment Manager invests in securities that it believes are positively exposed to environmentally- or socially-oriented sustainable investment themes derived from the UN Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs). The Investment Manager employs a combination of "top-down" and "bottom-up" investment processes. For the "top-down" approach, the Investment Manager identifies sustainable investment themes that are broadly consistent with achieving the UNSDGs such as Health, Climate, and Empowerment. These sustainable investment themes may change over time based on the Investment Manager's research. For the "bottom-up" approach, the Investment Manager analyses individual companies, focusing on assessing a company's exposure to environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors. The Investment Manager emphasises positive selection criteria, in particular by analysing the exposure to such ESG factors of each security or issuer, over broad-based negative screens in assessing an issuer's exposure to such ESG factors.

- Under normal market conditions, the Underlying Fund typically invests at least 80% of
 its assets in equity securities of issuers that the Investment Manager believes are
 positively aligned with sustainable investment themes. The Underlying Fund mainly
 invests in securities of companies that are organised, or have substantial business
 activities, in the US. These companies may be of any market capitalisation and industry.
- The Underlying Fund's equity investments may include convertible securities, REITs and ETFs.
- The Underlying Fund may be exposed to any currency.
- The Underlying Fund may use derivatives for efficient portfolio management ("EPM"), hedging or investment purposes.

KEY RISKS

WHAT ARE THE KEY RISKS OF THIS INVESTMENT?

The value of the ILP sub-fund may rise or fall. The following key risk factors may cause you to lose some or all of your investment:

Market and Credit Risks

You are exposed to Currency Risk.

To the extent that the Underlying Fund holds assets that are denominated in currencies other than its Base Currency, any changes in currency exchange rates could reduce investment gains or income, or increase investment losses, in some cases significantly. Hedging may reduce but not eliminate currency risk.

Liquidity Risks

The ILP sub-fund is not listed on the Singapore Exchange and you can redeem only on Business Days through Singapore Life Ltd. In respect of Singapore investors, there is no secondary market for the ILP sub-fund.



Product-Specific Risks

You are exposed to Derivatives Risks.

• Derivatives are financial contracts whose value is derived from that of an underlying asset, rate or eligible index. Small movements in the value of an underlying asset, reference rate or eligible index can create large changes in the value of a derivative, making derivatives highly volatile in general and exposing the Underlying Fund to potential losses significantly greater than the cost of the derivative. The Underlying Fund may use derivatives for various reasons, such as hedging, EPM and investment purposes. Derivatives are specialised instruments that require investment techniques and risk analyses different from those associated with traditional securities. Derivatives are subject to the risks of the underlying asset(s), typically in modified and greatly amplified form, as well as carrying their own risks.

You are exposed to Equity Securities Risks

Equities can lose value rapidly, in response to such factors as activities of individual
companies, general market or economic conditions, or changes in currency exchange
rates. Equities typically involve higher (often significantly higher) market risks than
bonds, money market instruments, or other debt securities. Purchases of initial public
offerings of stock (IPOs) may involve higher risks due to various factors including
limited shares, unseasoned trading, lack of investor knowledge and lack of operating
history of the issuing company.

You are exposed to Sustainability Risks

• Sustainability risk means an environmental, social, or governance event or condition that, if it occurs, could potentially or actually cause a material negative impact on the value of the Underlying Fund's investment. Sustainability risks can either represent a risk of their own or have an impact on other risks, and may contribute significantly to risks, such as market risks, operational risks, liquidity risks or counterparty risks. Sustainability risks may have an impact on long-term risk adjusted returns for investors. Assessment of sustainability risks is complex and may be based on environmental, social, or governance data which is difficult to obtain and incomplete, estimated, out of date or otherwise materially inaccurate. Even when identified, there can be no guarantee that these data will be correctly assessed.

VALUATIONS AND EXITING FROM THIS INVESTMENT

HOW OFTEN ARE VALUATIONS AVAILABLE?

All ILP sub-funds will be priced based on the frequency of the fund manager's pricing. The fund prices are updated daily and are available at Singapore Life Ltd.'s website at www.singlife.com

HOW CAN YOU EXIT FROM THIS INVESTMENT AND WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND COSTS IN DOING SO?

- You can exit the ILP sub-fund by submitting a request for withdrawal or fund switching (i.e. switches) to Singapore Life Ltd.
- If your Policy is newly incepted, you may cancel the Policy by giving us written notice of cancellation provided that such notice of cancellation is received by Singapore Life Ltd. at its Registered Office within the free-look period, which is fourteen (14) days from the date on which you receive the Policy.
- Upon cancellation of the Policy, Singapore Life Ltd. will refund the premiums you paid (without interest) after deducting the expenses incurred in issuing the Policy. The refund will be made after we receive the original Policy for cancellation.
- If there has been a decline in the market value, we will deduct the amount necessary to reflect the change in market value. If there has been an increase in the market value following the date Singapore Life Ltd. accepts your request to cancel the Policy, we will not pay you for such increase or any gain.
- For subsequent withdrawal/surrender or fund switching, transaction requests will need to be received and accepted by Singapore Life Ltd.:
 - (a) before 12 noon (Singapore time) on a Business Day will be processed according to the Unit Prices of the relevant Funds and the exchange rates (if applicable) prevailing on the next appropriate Fund Valuation Date following the day Singapore Life Ltd. has accepted the request.
 - (b) after 12 noon (Singapore time) on a Business Day or on a non-business day will be considered as if received before 12 noon (Singapore time) on the following business day.
- The ILP sub-fund will have a single "dealing" price used for all switches and withdrawals/surrenders. There is no bid/offer spread.
- All ILP sub-funds will be priced based on the frequency of the fund manager's pricing policy. As Units are cancelled using a forward price, the unit price for all switching and withdrawal of units will not be available at the time of receiving your application. This cut-off time stated is correct as at the time of print. Singapore Life Ltd. reserves the right to change the cut-off time by giving you thirty (30) days' prior notice or any such shorter period of notice as Singapore Life Ltd. may agree with the relevant authorities.
- The Withdrawal Amount you will receive as part of a subsequent withdrawal is illustrated as follows:

For a partial withdrawal request of 1000 units of an investment-linked fund.

- Assuming the unit price of the fund is S\$1.50:

The amount payable to the policyholder will be \$\$1500, which is calculated as 1000 units x \$\$1.50.

APPENDIX: GLOSSARY OF TERMS

2010 Law: The Luxembourg law of 17 December 2010 on Undertakings for Collective

Investment, as amended.

Business Day: Any day when both the New York Stock Exchange and Luxembourg banks are open

for business.

Dealing Deadline: All Share Classes, unless otherwise stated: 4:00 PM EST; currency hedged Share

Classes: 6:00 PM CET.

ETF: An exchange traded fund that qualifies as UCITS or eligible UCI within the meaning

of Article 41(1) e) of the 2010 Law.

Investment Manager: AllianceBernstein L.P., a Delaware limited partnership.

Management Company: AllianceBernstein (Luxembourg) S.à r.l.

NAV: The value of the total assets of an Underlying Fund less the total liabilities of such

Underlying Fund as described under the heading "Determination of the Net Asset

Value of Shares" in the Prospectus.

REITs: Real estate investment trusts eligible for investment under the 2010 Law.

UCI: An undertaking for collective investment.

UCITS: An undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities that comply with

the 2010 Law.

Valuation Date: The relevant Business Day on which the NAV of a class of Shares is determined.
